Suitable for any age! Have performed this with children, teenagers and adults.

2 NARRATORS	SARAH	VAN PERSON
FIRE ENGINE DRIVER	AA MAN	HOODIE
AMBULANCE PEOPLE		

PROPS AND COSTUME SUGGESTIONS

Keep it simple but if you can find/ make several driving wheels for actors to hold that's good. Also Fireman Hat, High visibility jacket for AA man, Hoodie + Twix + sweet + mobile Phone, White jackets for ambulance people.

NARRATOR 1: In the bible it says “Love your Neighbour”. Give us a hug

[Hugs Narrator 2 who looks awkward and pushes Narrator 1 away]

NARRATOR 2: One day someone asked Jesus,“Who is my neighbour?” That’s a good question. Is the person who lives next door to you?

NARRATOR 1: Or stands next to you, like me? So what was the answer?

NARRATOR 2: Jesus said “Let me tell you a story” and he did. It’s called “The Good Samaritan”

NARRATOR 1: We’re going to tell you a story too. Only this one is called: “Sarah and the Big Crash”.

Narrator 2 claps loudly or makes a noise. Sarah enters with steering wheel and acts according to the narrators’ spiel. Van driver is driving behind her also with wheel

NARRATOR 1: Sarah was driving from home to a shop, Saw traffic lights and had to stop.

NARRATOR 2: The van behind smashed into her car . Bang! Crack! Smash! Arrrh!

NARRATOR 1 The driver didn’t stop and help her out. S/He raced away...that horrible lout! *[van driver exits!]*

NARRATOR 2 Sarah was hurt with a bleeding head A broken leg and looking half dead

NARRATOR 1 Nere Nere Nere Nere Nere Nere
Never Fear the Fire Engine’s here! *[fire engine driver enters]*

FIRE ENGINE DRIVER: It’s not my job

NARRATOR 2: the driver said

FIRE ENGINE DRIVER: I'm far too busy,

NARRATOR 2: and off she sped *[Exit fire Engine Driver]*

NARRATOR 1 Not far behind came an AA man. *[enter AA man]*
A helpful sort with his helpful van.

AA MAN: I'm very helpful *[He gives the thumbs up and a big smile]*

NARRATOR 2 said the AA guy

AA MAN: But I can't stand blood!

NARRATOR 2 and he drove on by *[EXIT AA MAN] [ENTER HOODIE]*

NARRATOR 1 Along came a hoodie with his hood right down.
He heard Sarah's cries and it made him frown.

NARRATOR 2 He came in close, she was scared to death!
He looked quite rough and he had bad breath.

NARRATOR 1 He said,

HOODIE: Can I help? You're in a right fix.

NARRATOR 1 He rang for help and he gave her his Twix.

NARRATOR 2 He used his hoodie as a pillow for her head.
All the blood ran down and turned it red.

NARRATOR 1 He made her comfy and he stayed by her side.
He was still there when the ambulance arrived .

[Ambulance arrives, collects Sarah and takes her to 'hospital' – laying her down on a suitable table]

NARRATOR 2 He visited her in hospital - even gave her a sweet.
He had a good heart but he wasn't very neat.

NARRATOR 1 So that's the story of Sarah and the crash.
We hope you liked it especially the Bam! Crack! Smash!

[Narrator 2 claps hands/noise as at beginning]

NARRATOR 2: When he finished the story, Jesus asked everyone, - 'Who was the neighbour to the person who got hurt?' So we're going to ask you?

Who was the neighbour to Sarah? (Wait for the answer) Yes it was the one who helped.

NARRATOR 1:
Not the one who looks good. Oh No!
Not the one who sounds good. Oh No!
But the one who does good. Oh Yes!
